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UCAS Updates and continued pause on Unconditional Offers



UCAS continues to update information for students and advisers in response to the Covid-19 situation for students and advisers alike. The Government has asked universities and colleges across the UK to **stop making unconditional offers or amending existing offers until 4 May** (1 May in Wales). Many UK Universities are struggling to move online



Universities are seeking to create new online degrees across a range of faculties in a bid to offset huge losses from tens of thousands of international students cancelling their studies due to Covid-19. Prolonged social distancing could also mean freshers face a radically different university experience, with no lectures on campus and bars closed. According to Prof Sir Tim O'Shea, former vice-chancellor of Edinburgh University and a leading expert on computer-based learning, universities are facing costs of at least £10m to create five or six new online degrees but only around one in 20 are well equipped to deliver these by September. Students and graduates losing out on internships and job offers



Prospects Luminate are providing weekly updates on the impact of the lockdown on the graduate labour market. Some trends are emerging: larger recruiters and those based in London are looking more resilient than small employers. Impacts on hospitality, catering and beauty industries are particularly hard felt, recruitment in the health industry has grown (no surprise!) and the IT and Financial Services sectors seem to coping better than expected. However, in a recent survey with students and graduates, 11% reported losing a work placement or internship, 15% reported having a job offer deferred or cancelled and 15% lost their job. 29% reported considering a postgraduate course. Harvard and Cornell drop SAT and ACT requirements



With schools in lockdown and ACTs and SATS postponed, a growing number of USA colleges — **including Harvard and Cornell** — are waiving standardized testing requirements for 2021 applicants. Cornell go on to say that students who have taken a test, or even more than one test, but would still prefer not to submit those results, can also make that choice. So far, Yale and other high-profile universities of the Ivy League still require them, as do Stanford and highly selective colleges on the West Coast. But many of the schools that compete with those big names are moving ahead to make the tests optional. Read the NY Times article <u>here</u>.
