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Students should be ambitious with 2021 university applications



The number of students who chose to defer university entry in 2020 increased by only 0.1 % on the previous year which means that universities have more capacity than expected for 2021 applications. Clare Marchant, Chief Executive of UCAS says, "With no substantial rise in deferrals and many universities planning to raise their capacity, I encourage students to aim high as opportunities abound for them." Top 100 Apprenticeship Employers in England announced



The Top 100 Apprenticeship Employers were announced this week with the British Army topping the leader board followed by HMRC, Royal Navy, BT and MT Elizabeth Line. Over 400 applications were received for this new league table published by the Department of Education with High Fliers Research. The new rankings will help potential apprentices, parents and careers advisers identify the best apprenticeship opportunities with the highest performing apprentice employers in England. Boris Johnson said: "Now more than ever we should celebrate businesses who are driving our efforts to build a stronger, fairer, and more competitive economy. 50% of the workforce will need reskilling by 2025



According to the World Economic Forum's The Future of Jobs Report published this month, 50% of employees will need re-skilling by 2025 due to the double disruption of automation and the pandemic. Critical thinking and problem-solving top the list of skills that employers believe will grow in prominence in the next five years. These have been consistent since the first report in 2016 but newly emerging are skills in self-management such as active learning, resilience, stress tolerance and flexibility. 3 Top universities won't accept T-Levels and 10 others are undecided



The first T-Level courses began this autumn with 44 providers offering courses in Education & Childcare, Construction and Digital. A further 7 T Levels will be available in September 2021 with the remainder starting in 2022 or 2023. The Department of Education states that T-Levels will be awarded the same UCAS points as A levels with a Distinction* equal to 3 A*s at A level. From the Russell Group, only Warwick University has confirmed that it will accept T Levels for 2022 entry. Cambridge, Imperial and Queen Mary have said they will not. A further 10 universities remain undecided and are awaiting further specifications and details. Read more here.
