Careers & Enterprise Company launches JPMorganChase partnership for work experience



The Careers & Enterprise Company have announced a £3.3m investment from JPMorganChase for a partnership to widen access to high-quality work experience for young people from disadvantaged backgrounds. The Future Ready Fund will give 3,700 young people in 250 schools two weeks of work experience, supporting them from year 8 to year 10. It focuses on students on free school meals, SEND and at risk of becoming NEET. Read more here.

95,000 GCSE pupils to receive exam results digitally in trial - CDI News 25th June



CDI News reports that in a trial of digital exam results, 95,000 pupils in Greater Manchester and West Midlands will receive their GCSE exam results via the new Education Record app, replacing the paper results sent to schools that pupils then must collect. Part of the government's reforms across post-16 education, moving to digital results could save around £30m each year.

WONKE and The Post-18 Project paper: Tooling up



WONKHE's new paper *The Post-18 Project: Tooling Up* calls for government action to better align higher education, skills, and economic growth. It argues that the current market-led approach isn't working and urges the government to take a more active role in shaping the system. The paper recommends setting up new regional bodies to coordinate efforts between colleges, universities, and employers to meet local skills needs. Read the full paper here.

World largest survey published of teenagers' career preparation



Education and Employers funded OECD research into the career aspirations and readiness of teenagers around the world. In the largest survey of its kind, the survey heard from 700,000 15-year-olds in 80 countries and economies. It found teenagers have high levels of career uncertainty and confusion, while job expectations have remained similar to those in 2000 – bearing little relationship to actual labour market demand.
