First list of Foundation Apprenticeships published – FE Week, 19th May 2025



The list of the first Foundation apprenticeships has been published on the Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education's website today First list of foundation apprenticeships. It confirms the name, sector and funding band of each, as well as that the minimum duration is expected to be 8 months, though this will be confirmed once legislation is passed, and the earliest start date as 1st August. DfE updated Statutory Guidance on Careers Guidance and access - 8th May 2025



The DfE published the updated Statutory Guidance on Careers guidance and access for Education and Training Providers on the 8th of May. The Statutory Guidance covers the updated Gatsby Benchmarks, recommendations from the Gatsby ten-year review and introduces the government's new work experience policy. FSC is pleased to see the focus on embedding careers advisers, valuing personal careers guidance (Gatsby 8) and recognising qualified Career Development professionals.

UCAS data shows university applications for AI degrees rise 15% – The London Standard



A thoughtful article from The London Standard University applications for AI degrees rise 15% on news that applications to AI degrees have risen 15% as compared with a fall in computing applications, with a 15% rise from female students, versus 12% male. The article discusses the benefits to the changing digital economy, AI and information systems as emerging fields and the step towards a more diverse workforce.
