School leaver recruitment trends of 2021



Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Virtual Conference

UCAS end of 2021 cycle data published



UCAS data for the end of 2021 cycle shows that over 100,000 UK 18-year-olds were accepted onto courses at the most competitive universities and colleges last year, up 11% from 2020 and an increase of 28% from 2019. This rise comes despite the 3% increase in the UK's 18-year-old population. In addition, the number of UK 18-year-olds choosing to defer their course for a year rose by 15%. The data also shows that the number of applicants achieving A level grades equivalent to three A*s nearly quadrupled from pre-pandemic levels to 19,595 (5,655 in 2019), and close to doubled compared to 2020 (12,735). School leaver recruitment trends of 2021



School and college leavers made up 20% of student hires reported in this year's Institute of Student Employers Student Recruitment Survey. There continue to be indications that some companies are beginning to rebalance entry-level recruitment away from graduates by taking on more school leavers. Capita to run The Turing Scheme



Capita has been selected by the Department for Education (DfE) to run the new Turing Scheme, the UK's replacement for the Erasmus+ programme that supports students wishing to study and train overseas. The Turing Scheme will be worth £6.27m to Capita who will also be responsible for promoting the scheme to organisations and students, managing and delivering bids and assessing applications. Capita will replace The British Council who has been the lead partner since The Turing scheme was launched in February 2021. To find out more click here.

Trends in Careers Education



A new report by The Careers & Enterprise Company (CEC), Trends in Careers Education 2021, looks at changes in careers education over the course of the pandemic. The analysis reveals that more schools and colleges are now successfully linking lessons to jobs and careers. The data also shows that 84% of schools provided information about apprenticeships to their students, but CEC cautioned that "more work needs to be done to convert interest in apprenticeships to uptake." Other changes in careers education included more young people than ever taking part in one-to-one careers guidance sessions.
