Apprenticeship incentives were strengthened in last week's budget, but a recent report by The Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development (CIPD) said since the apprenticeship levy was introduced in 2017, apprenticeship starts have fallen and the number of apprenticeships to under-19s fell from 122,800 to only 76,300. UCAS Undergraduate Applicant Analysis



The latest Undergraduate Applicant Analysis shows a substantial rise in the number of applicants to Nursing and a decrease in the number of EU students applying. NHS Learning Support Fund



The NHS Learning Support Fund offers a non-means tested Training Grant of £5,000 each academic year for eligible students on a pre-registration undergraduate or postgraduate course. The eligible courses are dental therapy/dental hygiene (level 5 and 6 courses), dietetics, midwifery, nursing, occupational therapy, operating department practitioner (level 5 and 6 courses), orthoptics, orthotics and prosthetics, paramedics (bachelors and masters), physiotherapy, podiatry/chiropody, radiography (diagnostic and therapeutic) and speech and language therapy. International student exchange Turing Scheme now open for bids



The UK Govt's new Turing Scheme will allow students to study and work abroad from September 2021 and will target those from disadvantaged backgrounds. The DfE has now launched a website with funding rates and eligibility criteria ahead of a six-week bidding process. Open to Universities, Schools, FE Colleges and including apprentices, placements will range from 2 weeks to 12 months. Students with SEND will be funded or "up to 100 per cent of actual costs for support directly related to their additional needs". For further information see here.
