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Students and graduates in England will pay up to 12% interest on their loans this autumn, according to the Institute for Fiscal Studies (IFS). For students starting degree courses from 2023, the rate will be fixed at a lower level. The interest rate on the loan for those currently at university in England is calculated by adding 3% to the retail price index (RPI) measure of inflation. After graduation the interest rate is linked to pay, so those earning £27,295 or less are charged RPI, although they do not make repayments until they earn above that amount annually. Graduates who do earn more each year are charged interest at RPI+3%. To read more click <u>here.</u>

QS World University Rankings by Subject 2022



The <u>QS World University Rankings by Subject 2022</u> have highlighted the quality of the British higher education system with UK universities being ranked among the best in the world across several subjects. The **University of Oxford** and the **University of Cambridge** have been ranked first and second respectively for Humanities and Arts. There are lots of success stories across specific subjects too with **London's Royal College of Music** ranking top for Performing Arts, the **Royal College of Art** (London) and **University of the Arts London** ranking first and second respectively in Art and Design.

Report finds degree grade matters more than university reputation



Students are advised to be "more relaxed" about the reputation of the universities they want to attend, after new research revealed they could be better off graduating with a good degree from a less prestigious university than with a lower-class degree from a selective institution. The <u>report by</u> <u>the Institute for Fiscal Studies</u> found that graduates in England with first-class or upper second class (2.1) honours degrees had higher average earnings by the age of 30 than those who finished with lower second-class (2.2) awards, regardless of institution.

New Natural History GCSE



New plans announced by Education Secretary Nadhim Zahawi detail how the UK education sector is to become a world leader in climate change by 2030. Part of this includes the introduction of a new GCSE in Natural History to start in 2025. Students who study the new GCSE will explore the world by learning about organisms and environments, environmental and sustainability issues, and gain a deeper knowledge of the natural world around them.
