Ambitious about Autism



The Education Committee has **published a report called 'Solving the SEND Crisis'** following its inquiry into the Special Educational Needs and Disabilities system. Responding to the Committee's findings, Chief Executive of Autism Charity | Ambitious about Autism Jolanta Lasota, said:

"As this report identifies, autistic young people and their parents have lost faith in the SEND system. Trust and confidence have been eroded by long delays and failures to get young people with SEND the help they need to achieve in education.

Asda doubles internship programme for young people with additional needs



Asda marked National Inclusion Week in September 2025 with a major expansion of its industry-leading supported internship programme, reaffirming the retailer's commitment to creating meaningful employment opportunities for young people with learning difficulties or disabilities. Asda doubled the number of interns and stores participating in this year's programme with 119 students expected to start a placement across 22 stores nationwide offering year-long placements that combine real-world experience with tailored education. 2025 Youth Voice Census Report shows career experiences are narrowing for young people



Download the Youth Voice Census Results | 2025 by Youth Employment UK to read the in-depth analysis of 8,200 young voices and what they think about their life, education and work. Only around a third of young people reported having a part-time job, down from 40-42% previously, and, while 76% say they value work experience, only 26% said they undertook any last year.

Yet 55% feel they have skills employers want, though young women, FSM students and

those with additional needs all had lower confidence.

Overall the report found an increase in 'middling' responses to much of the survey – with fewer good and bad responses – considered a sign of fatigue rather than contentment. Support for wellbeing is improving but the levels of wellbeing reported by young people was flat.

School support is improving generally, but careers advice, work experience and employer engagement all declined.

Careers and Enterprise Company – Final Report from pilot in Primary Schools



The Careers & Enterprise Company have partnered with Careers Hubs, schools in areas of high deprivation, employers, and Teach First to launch **Start Small; Dream Big.** This pioneering programme set out to investigate how career-related learning in primary schools could broaden horizons, build skills, and create the foundations for opportunity. Education Business Partnership Supported Internships - Let's Talk Cornwall



Supported Internships help young people aged 16-24 with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) get into work. The internships help young people to learn the skills they need for work and they spend most of the time in the employers workplace. They are also an exciting opportunity to study for qualifications such as English and Maths. Young people get the extra help of a job coach who works with them and their employer. Supported Internships are unpaid but aim to help young people to get into paid work at the end of their internship.
